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Michigan Education Justice Coalition Reacts to Gov. Whitmer State of the State Address

We also hope the Governor's upcoming budget address will join us in calling for new funds to ensure the closing of the \$5 billion gap in funding for our k-12 education system so that we can adequately meet the needs of our youth across the state."
